# **Summary of Decisions of the Building Committee Building Committee I 26/2005 held on 12.7.2005**

## (a) MAI 1 26/2005

Issue : Exclusion of excessive carparking spaces and associated circulation

areas of a single-family house from GFA calculation.

Decision : The committee noted that the authorized person opined the previous

decision to require the inclusion of the excessive carparks into GFA was wrongfully, the Chairman directed CBS to refer the case for

BAC's consideration.

## (b) <u>BCI 1 26/2005</u>

Issue : Proposed surrender for lane widening in return for bonus PR & SC for

an office building development.

Decision : The committee noted that the surrender was required for the purpose

of lane widening. Taking into account the comments made by other government departments, the committee accepted the proposed

surrender in return for bonus PR & SC.

## (c) BCI 2 26/2005

Issue : Proposed low density residential development with trellises and RC

cover on the private roofs to be included in GFA calculation.

Decision : Having considered the PlanD and LandsD's views, the committee

agreed that trellises and reinforced concrete cover on the private roofs

should be included in GFA calculation.

## (d) BCI 3 26/2005

Issue : Proposed A&A to extend the shop on G/F into the open yard of a 6/s

composite building which was built under the "Volume" calculation.

Decision : A reassessment of the existing building revealed that the existing

domestic flats on the upper floors exceeded the permissible site coverage set out in the first schedule. Having noted that the PR would not exceed the permissible under the First Schedule and that no proposed works would be carried out to the domestic flats on the upper floors, the committee agreed to permit the existing domestic site

coverage to exceed the permissible under the B(P)Reg.

## (e) BCI 4 26/2005

Issue : Proposed 17-storey residential building without the provision of a

service lane.

Decision : Having noted that there was no existing lane pattern in vicinity and

that there was no prospect of creating a new one in the future, the

committee accepted the proposal.
